

- GRANT 2: ROBIN DE ANDRÉS GRANT
 Awarded to a Primary or Secondary teacher working in the Spanish Education system giving a presentation at the convention.
- GRANT 3: FULL TIME UNIVERSITY STUDENT GRANT
 Awarded to a full time university student resident and
 studying in Spain.
- GRANT 4: PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT GRANT
 Awarded to a new (or recently qualified) teacher resident in Spain.
- GRANT 5: TESOL-SPAIN GLOBAL GRANT FOR SPEAKERS FROM AFRICA, ASIA, OR LATIN AMERICA Awarded to a teacher from Africa, Asia or Latin America attending the TESOL-SPAIN Annual Convention as a speaker.
